
Reframing how we think, feel, and act about older age

Bhí sé ina bhall d'fhoireann oibrithe deonacha Gaillimh 2020, áit ar chuidigh sé cláir a chur le chéile agus imeachtaí a eagrú. Is mór an cúnamh a thug sé lena chinntiú gurbh í tairiscint Chathair na Gaillimhe a roghnaíodh i gcomórtas a raibh mórchathracha Eorpacha eile istigh air freisin.

Chomh maith leis sin, bíonn obair dheonach ar bun go páirtaimseartha ag Andy mar Stiúrthóir Airgeadais in eagraíocht charthanachta i nGaillimh, TREM House of Mercy.

Nuair nach mbíonn sé ag obair, is maith leis an léitheoireacht agus a bheith ag siúl ar mhaithe leis an bhfolláine, agus is fear mór spóirt é freisin.

Andy is a Nigerian-Irishman in his mid 60's, who moved to Galway in 2015 to enable him to live with his wife and family of five children. Though qualified as an Economist, his interest in community development came to the fore in the early 90's when he became a project manager of an organisation (Operation the Youths Must Survive) which provided enlightenment during the scourge of the HIV/AIDS pandemic. It was a community-based organisation which visited schools, offices, motor parks and other public places offering information and education to the community.

After coming to Ireland, Andy began volunteering with Ability West where he took service users on social outings for indoor games and drinks once a week. He also worked with Enable Ireland, helping with fundraising and with Galway 2020 where he was part of the volunteering team which helped to put together programs and activities – assisting in no small way to ensure Galway City won the competitive bid also entered by other notable European Cities.

Andy also volunteers on a part-time basis as a Finance Director in a charity organisation in Galway, TREM House of Mercy.

In his free time, he enjoys reading and walking to keep a healthy lifestyle and is an avid sports enthusiast.









Is iomaí cuimhne gheal atá aici ón gceantar, áit a ndeachaigh sí ag damhsa le cairde nua, agus áit ar chas sí ar a fear céile, a phós sí in 1954. Naonúr páistí atá ag Angela agus 15 gharpháiste. Cúigear páistí atá ag na garpháistí agus beirt atá sa chéad ghlúin eile. Is duine í Angela a thugann faoin saol go gníomhach fonnmhar. Born in 1934, Angela was a fostered-out child, who grew up in the Craughwell area. She worked in Merlin Park from her late teens, where she has many fond memories of making new friends to go to dances with and meeting her husband, whom she married in 1954. Angela has 9 children, 15 grandchildren, 5 great grandchildren and 2 great-great grandchildren. She has a lust for life, with many passions and interests, which are very evident in her captivating stories.

As Angela reminisces, you can see the glint in her eyes. From the memories of the evenings she spent playing bingo, dancing the evening away in The Astaire, or The Seapoint and maybe finishing the night off dancing in The Hangar (her favourite ballroom).

Angela is the embodiment of positive ageing; she won't let anything keep her down. She now spends many of her days sitting in her sun trapped porch, watching the world go by, meeting up with friends, sharing stories, singing songs and listening to what is going on in the world for younger generations.

Anne also enjoys line dancing, aquafit, ancestry research and baking for friends and relatives is her much loved pastime. Never one to stop learning, she returned to cycling again during COVID restrictions and thoroughly enjoys it!



Ón uair a bhí Con ina fhear óg ag fás aníos in Ard Ó bhFicheallaigh lasmuigh de Chloich na Coillte, bhí sé gníomhach i gcónaí ina phobal. Bhí tionchar mór ag gluaiseacht na gcomharchumann – áit ar oibrigh comharsana agus pobail as lámha a chéile chun cabhrú le chéile, jabanna a dhéanamh sa cheantar, agus bheith ag obair mar ghrúpa – ar a dhearcadh ar an saol ón uair sin i leith. Rinne sé staidéar ar Eolaíocht Tuaithe agus Shóisialta i gColáiste na hOllscoile, Corcaigh, chuaigh sé ina Chomhairleoir Talmhaíochta agus bhí sé ina Stiúrthóir Ceantair sa Roinn Talmhaíochta nuair a chuaigh sé ar scor. 'Chaith mé 43 bliain ag obair agus bhain mé taitneamh as gach lá de. I nDún na nGall a bhuail mé le Eileen, mo bhean chéile álainn – bhí sí sách 'top of pops'! Pósadh muid in 1967, tá seisear páistí againn agus dáréag sa gharchlann.'

Rud eile a thug pobail le chéile arbh ea Cumann Lúthchleas Gael agus bhí Con sáite ann ar feadh a shaoil, ní hé amháin ar an bpáirc imeartha ach ag obair leis an eagraíocht féin ó bhí sé 15 bliana d'aois, nuair a bhí sé ina Rúnaí ar an gClub ag St. James', Ardfield. Bhí róil éagsúla aige agus go leor freagrachtaí eile air freisin le St. James' eile, in Mervue an babhta seo.

'Thug mé faoi deara le linn na paindéime go raibh an saol an-deacair ar go leor daoine nach raibh aon ghníomhaíocht ná cairde acu.' Is é an chomhairle a chuirfeadh Con ar gach duine, idir óg agus aosta, ná dul amach agus páirt a ghlacadh sa saol mór. 'Gheobhaidh tú ról i gcónaí, aimseoidh tú rud úsáideach le déanamh i do phobal féin.'

Since Con was a young man growing up in Ardfield outside Clonakilty, he has always been active in his community. From an early age the co-op movement – where neighbours and communities worked together to help each other out, do local jobs, work as a group – was a big influence on his outlook in life. He studied Rural and Social Science in University College Cork, became an Agricultural Advisor and retired as a District Superintendent in the Department of Agriculture. 'I worked 43 years and enjoyed every day of it. I met my lovely wife Eileen in Donegal, she was fairly "top of the pops"! We got married in 1967, have 6 children and 12 grandchildren.'

The GAA was another avenue where communities came together and Con has been steeped in GAA all his life, not only playing but taking on responsibilities within the organisation from the youthful age of 15, when he was the Club Secretary in his local St. James', Ardfield, to taking on various roles and many other responsibilities with another St. James' in Mervue.

'I found during COVID a lot of people who had no activity or friends found it very hard.' Con's advice to everyone, young and old is to get out and keep yourself involved. 'You'll always find a role, find something useful to do in your community.'

She loves being a Galwegian and a member of the deaf community and continues to advocate for fairness and equality for the deaf community.













He loves nature and he and his wife enjoy travelling and exploring the 'beautiful places' around Ireland. They have shown that it is never too late to take on a challenge (and an adventure) and Asgher says he now feels 'like this country is my own country and Irish people are my people'.

One of 3 self-employed deaf people in Galway, despite the challenges he experienced, Kevin ran the business on his own and never let his deafness be a barrier to working in the community.

Kevin's entire family including himself, his wife and their only son are all deaf sign language users. He was a founder member of the Galway Deaf Centre 53 years ago and sat on many a committee, where he is still an active member and volunteer along with others from all over the City and County.

While living in Ballybane, Kevin won many awards and presentations for his flowers and garden over the years. After retiring he moved home to Ballyglunin, where he still does a small bit of part-time shoe repair work and enjoys working on his garden.

Kevin wants to keep active and to learn, recently doing a cookery class. He also likes to head off in his campervan and he still does some special orders making adaptive shoes. He enjoys using his skills to do good and help people even though he is retired.

Is bean í atá chun tosaigh ar a ré féin – bhí sí ag obair chun an t-aonrú sóisialta a sheachaint ina pobal tuaithe fiú sula raibh taighde againn a léirigh tionchar an uaignis ar shláinte daoine. Creideann Margaret sa tábhacht a bhaineann leis an intinn agus an corp a aclú, agus bíonn sí ag siúl go rialta, déanann sí píosa léitheoireachta gach lá, agus is breá léi tabhairt faoin gcrosfhocal uair sa tseachtain.

Is cinnte go bhféadfaí an seantéarma Gaeilge 'Meitheal' a lua le Margaret agus is mór an spreagadh a thugann sí dúinn go léir. Margaret lives in Cashel, Connemara and is almost 80 years. She has six children, eight grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Margaret cared for her late husband and best friend Josie until his death in 2022 and had cared for her late parents also. She is a wonderful and considerate neighbour.

Margaret is very well known in her community for her voluntary work. She and her late husband set up St. Conal's Social Club in 1992, to provide social support for older people. She is a lady ahead of her time, who was helping to prevent social isolation in her rural community, before we had research showing the impact of loneliness on people's health. She and her small team of volunteers fundraised to provide weekly meetings, breakfast, annual Christmas dinners, a respite weekend break and day trips for the older people.

Margaret has sat on the Board of Management of the local school and has represented the Cashel Pony Show Committee for 30 years. Margaret believes in the importance of keeping the mind and body active, and walks regularly, reads every day, and she loves her weekly crosswords.

Margaret epitomises the old Irish term 'Meitheal' and is truly an inspiration to us all.



Saol an-chrua a bhí ann agus í ag dul ó bhaile go baile i bpuball. Ní raibh aon oideachas ar Mary agus in 1964, agus í 17 mbliana d'aois, chuaigh sí chuig a haintín i Sasana chun post a chuardach. Chuaigh Mary go dtí ranganna oíche i Sasana agus d'fhoghlaim sí conas léamh agus scríobh. Nuair a d'fhill sí ar Éirinn sna 70idí thosaigh sí ag obair mar ghníomhaí don Lucht Siúil, agus ba í ba chúis le hathruithe móra ar shaol mhná an Lucht Siúil. In 1983 d'éirigh léi ina cuid iarrachtaí ionad oiliúna a oscailt i dTuaim do dhaoine den Lucht Siúil, idir óg agus sean.

Scríobh sí dhá leabhar, 'Turn of the Hand' agus 'Travellers Settled'.

Mary is a proud Traveller woman living in Tuam. She is a mother, grandmother and friend to everyone. She is very actively involved in supporting Travellers and has a keen interest in investigating the family tree of Travellers down through the generations.

Mary was born in 1943 and came from a family of seven. Her father was a chimney sweep and tin smith. Her mother made paper flowers and went house to house trading items such as hair clips, and holy pictures in return for food. It was a very hard life as she moved from town to town in a tent. Mary had no education and in 1964 at the age of 17, she went to her aunt in England to find work. She met her husband Frank Moriarty there while working in the hospital, a settled man from Cavan.

Mary went to night classes in England and learned how to read and write. Returning to Ireland in the 70's she began working as a Traveller activist, making significant changes to the lives of Traveller women. In 1983 she was successful in her efforts to open a training centre in Tuam for Travellers of all ages.

She went on to write two books 'Turn of the Hand' and 'Travellers Settled'.








