COPE Galway Choir gives "inspiring" performance at Choir Factor event

Last March, the COPE Galway choir, a group of staff members, volunteers and clients, performed at 'Choir Factor', the annual choral fundraising event in aid of the SCCUL Sanctuary.

The group sang Elvis Presley's 'Can't Help Falling in Love' and Clare Sands' 'Awe na Mna' (Praise the Woman), which they learnt over ten weeks. On the day they performed alongside another community choir from Ukraine and three established choirs

- ATU Staff Choir, High Fidelity and Medtronic Harmonics. Our choir truly rose to the occasion and gave it their all on the day.

Choir Director Ronan De Burca said the COPE Galway choir performance made a big impact and was a shining example of how much enjoyment can come from getting involved in a choir. The judges offered special praise for their "inspiring and spirited performance".

Our Older People's Service has even more opportunities for older community members to engage in social activities and stay connected.

At Sonas Drop-in Centre, residents in Mervue and Renmore find a welcome space to call in for a cuppa and a chat, with plenty of opportunities to meet up with old friends and make some new ones, play board games or get involved with whatever activities are taking place that day.

Around the corner from Sonas, our newer community hub, The Bungalow, also offers a range of activities where older people can get active, such as yoga, as well as social activities including tea mornings and lunch clubs.

Our staff and volunteers are always on hand to help clients with practical supports, and to link them to other services.

We are always keen to ask older people for their ideas about what they would like to do and recently, we held a series of activator pole classes to promote balance and improve mobility.

The weekly class, which had between 10 and 12 participants, ran over 13 weeks and was hosted by instructor Alan Raycroft, through Galway City Partnership sponsorship.

The feedback from participants was great and they want to keep it up.

Galway City Partnership is looking for people who want to train and become instructors, or people who are already trained, to help continue the classes.

As well as the Mervue lunch club which takes place in the Bungalow on Thursdays, Sonas Drop-in Centre is now also offering a nutritional breakfast to clients. The team at Sonas had become aware that some clients were not eating a proper breakfast and were coming to Sonas in the morning to have a tea or coffee with biscuits, rather than having a good breakfast. There was also a social aspect to introducing the breakfast, as some clients had expressed a desire to eat less meals alone.



"It is all about older people and responding to what they need" said Louise Glynn, Older People Service Support Worker, "so we regularly ask them for suggestions for what would improve their quality of life".

Volunteers offer a weekly home visit, where they have a chat and a cuppa and offer practical help such as light housework, shopping and prescription collection if needed. Our befriending service is delivered by trusted volunteers who are vetted, trained and supported by COPE Galway.

Meet Volunteer Food Rescue Driver

Every week, Peter (70) collects surplus food from our retail partners, brings it to our Community Catering depot and then redistributes it across COPE Galway services.

Peter first started volunteering with COPE Galway back in 2000, delivering meals to people out in the community. He had picked up a flyer asking for volunteers One Sunday at Mass, and said he wanted to give something back.

"The first day was scary," he said. He remembers getting lost while making deliveries in Shantalla. "It was such a maze and some of the houses didn't have numbers. I thought I would never get my head around this!".

Once he got his bearings, Peter enjoyed meeting all the different people in the community who he said were always happy to see him. There was one woman whose delivery he would leave until last because she always invited him in for a chat.

So what has he learnt over the 23 years? "I learned a lot about people, and how appreciative and thankful they are," he said.

He also looks forward to going to Community Catering on a Friday morning and having a cup of tea with the team who he says are 'great craic'. 66 I don't have any plans to give it up, so long as I'm enjoying it. I'm still enjoying it as much as I did the first day if I'm honest. I come away after I've volunteered and say to myself, 'I've done a good morning's work'."

Students had a maximum spending budget of just €5 on their second day, which added to the experience and tremendous achievement of this group of enthusiastic students. Well done and thank you to everyone who took part and all those who supported this event.

Additionally, as part of Catholic Schools Week in February, teachers and pupils organised a Shave, Dye or Wax event, themed 'Walking with the Excluded'. The event went beyond its target, raising €1,384 for our Older People's Service.
